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Introducing the Marie Curie Daffodil standards

The Marie Curie Daffodil Standards were created in conjunction with the Royal Pharmaceutical Society. It is a voluntary programme that asks pharmacies to reflect on their practice as it relates to the provision of palliative care services. They have been designed specifically to **not** create a burden of work.

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Palliative Care resources, clinical information and feedback

Addressing issues raised at the Network ECHO talk

At the last ECHO meeting, a number of issues and suggestions cropped up:

- 1. Pharmacists were keen for improved links to out of hours to manage medication supply and to try to improve the selection of medication strengths and drug choice in line with stock holdings to prevent delays
- 2. Some suggested improved links to community nurse specialists
- 3. More up to date information sheets on specific medicines
- 4. Alerts for shortages

While some of these issues will likely require long and persistent intervention, the following actions have already been proposed:

- Production of a poster for out of hours centres to specifically address the most common type of selection errors, e.g. midazolam 5mg/5ml or morphine 10mg/10ml. To also include directions needed for a legal prescription.

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- 2. The Network co-ordinator will link attempt to link with community nurse specialists, including Northern Ireland Hospice specialist nurses, and encourage them to make links with their local network pharmacies.
- 3. Please see the resources section of this newsletter for links to the Microguide app. New medicines information is being added to the Belfast Trust Microguide website and app all the time, and is available for free either on a website or via your phone. If you have any suggestions for information you would like to see here, please contact the network co-ordinator to discuss.
- 4. The Network co-ordinator will stay abreast of shortages relating to palliative care medicines and suggest alternatives or workarounds as they arise.
