

Changing Lives Through Community Pain Support Programmes



Pain Support Programmes (PSP) run by Northern Ireland (NI) community Healthy Living Centres (HLC) were recently recognised with two prestigious PrescQIPP awards:

- Winner: Category: Developing or Working across Integrated Care/Sustainability and Transformation Partnerships
- **Silver Award**: Voted second place overall of all 2020 award winners.

Background: An estimated 1 in 5 people in Northern Ireland live with chronic pain. Medication relieves chronic pain by around 30% only, in most cases. The PSPs aim to help people with chronic pain to learn new ways to manage their pain, reduce their reliance on medication and improve their quality of life.



The Programmes

32 twelve week PSPs were run in 16 HLCs across NI between September 2019 and March 2020. These were attended by approximately 500 people with chronic pain. Each week is devoted to specific activities known to help chronic pain. For example, as keeping moving is important, every week involves some light physical activity. Other weeks cover looking after your mind, the role of medication (by a local pharmacist) and the importance of having a 'pain self-management toolkit'. Sessions are also devoted to peer learning and sharing.



Examples of outcomes and feedback from the programmes (Sept - Dec 2019):

- 78% of participants completed the programme
- At the beginning of the programme, only 15% used self management strategies in addition to medication. This increased to 83% at week 12, and 91% 3 months after the end of the PSP
- 68% of all participants attended 8+ sessions and this resulted in an increase in Pain Self Efficacy¹ score for each individual of between 6-8 points (out of a total of 16).

"I was in utter shock when we talked about tablets and how we can become dependent (I myself was going that way!) I've learned that they don't control me, I control them!"

"I found the programme life-changing, mentally as well as physically" "My first thought was that it (the pain programme) was going to take my pain away. Then I realised it's not going to go away but that I can manage it much better"

¹ Pain Self Efficacy measures a person's confidence in functioning in the presence of pain.

January — March 2021 Programmes

HLCs (23 centres) continue to run PSPs and are now planning for the January – March 2021 programmes (see overleaf for list of participating centres and contact details). The programmes are open for self-referral; no formal referral is required. Centres will host PSPs virtually (e.g. via Zoom) according to local needs, and/or host small groups in line with social distancing and health and hygiene requirements. Where groups are held virtually, participants must be internet ready.

- Contact local HLCs to find out more about the PSPs and other services which may benefit their patients
- Signpost patients who may benefit from the PSPs to a participating centre.
